I've been involved in the world of purebred dogs for as long as I can remember. My family bred and showed Irish Setters, and as a junior I began breeding English Cockers under the Wilspride prefix. After apprenticing with Garry MacDonald in Canada and Bobby Stebbins in the United States, I turned professional in 1986. The following year, I made history by handling Ch. McCammom Impresario, an Irish Setter, to Top Dog All Breeds, becoming the youngest handler ever to earn that distinction.

Over the years, I've had the privilege of working with many of Canada's top-winning dogs, including several in the Terrier Group. I have shown Border Terriers earning multiple Best in Show and National Specialty wins with the breed. Their soundness, confidence, and honest working character have given me a lasting appreciation for Terriers and the qualities that make them so special to evaluate. I co-own two Borders, one currently in the show ring and the other is now spending most of his time in performance events.

Today, I continue to share my experience through DogShowTips.com and my seminar series "Handle Your Way Out of a Paper Bag." Whether I am judging, teaching, or simply watching dogs work, I remain inspired by the dedication and purpose that define our sport and the breeds we love.

JUVENILE AND VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES, JUNIOR HANDLING

Caleb Campbell, Washington, USA



Biography: Thank you to the Border Terrier Canada – Specialty Committee for inviting me to judge Sweepstakes and Junior Handling at your 2026 National Specialty!

I have been exhibiting Border Terriers since I was 12-years-old. I was active in 4-H and AKC Junior Showmanship growing up and have remained active in both events in different avenues today with the breed. When competing in Junior Showmanship, I earned Best Junior Handler at the Border Terrier Club of America National Specialty several times and was ranked as the top Junior Handler in the USA in the Terrier group multiple years along with being ranked number two of all breeds combined in Junior Showmanship in the USA at the end of 2015.

I have learned from countless mentors throughout the breed during my time in Juniors and have continued learning as a breeder under the kennel name of McMullin – a tribute to my first Border Terrier, Mullins. I serve as Chairperson of the Border Terrier Club of America Juniors Committee and had the honor of serving as Chairperson of the 2025 Border Terrier Club of America National Specialty.

It is an honor for me to judge Sweepstakes and Junior Handling at the Canadian National Specialty for Border Terriers. I look forward to evaluating the up-and-comers – both dogs and handlers – along with the chance to enjoy the veterans!

Note: There will be no refunds for duplicate entries or overpayment of fees.

It is the owner of the dog entered that is responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Please review email confirmations so corrections may be made **prior to closing date** to avoid disappointment.

4.1.5 No person may approach a judge whether directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

BORDER CROSSING

A Rabies Certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada. Government regulations require this Certificate and **MUST** be dated at least 30 days prior to re-entry into the US.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex and variety) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS – This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs.

VETERANS CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years to 10 years of age, 10 years to 13 years of age and 13+ years of age on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

FIELD CLASS - Dogs entered in this class must have attained a Regular CKC Earthdog Title ie. JE, GJE, SE, GSE, ME, GME, GMEX - these dogs do not compete for Winners but the first place Male/Female from this class will compete for Best of Breed.

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO breed judging. TCN Fees WILL NOT be refunded.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

BABY PUPPY - This class is for dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show.

STUD DOG & GET - This class is for a stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership need not be identical. The stud dog may be spayed/neutered and must be entered in a regular class or in exhibition only. Get must be entered in a regular class

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY - This class has the same requirements as the Stud Dog and Get

BRACE - This class is for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily the same sex). A brace must be handled by one person on one lead.

BREEDER'S TEAM - This class is for three to five dogs bred by the same breeder.

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASS - This class is for dogs which have been spayed or neutered.

SWEEPSTAKES- Saturday July 11, 2026, preceding Regular Conformation Classes

Juvenile Sweepstakes

Judge: Caleb Campbell

Juvenile Sweepstakes is open to all Border Terrier puppies of at least four months and under eighteen months of age, regardless of place of birth. All dogs must be entered in one of the regular official classes on the same day. Dogs will be judged in one of the following four classes divided by sex.

- 4 months to under 6 months
- 6 months to under 9 months
- 9 months to under 12 months
- 12 months to under 18 months

For final judging the first place puppy from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes- rosette and 15% of total fees collected for the juvenile sweepstakes

Best of Opposite in sweepstakes- rosette and 10% of total fees collected for the Juvenile sweepstakes

1st in each class- rosette and 50% of entry fees for that class

25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs.

Veteran Sweepstakes

- following the judging of the juvenile sweepstakes

Judge: Caleb Campbell

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all dogs 7 years of age and over and entered in a regular class or for exhibition only on the same day. Spayed and neutered dogs may compete provided they are also entered in exhibition only.

Dogs to be judges in one of the following classes (divided by sex):

- 7 years and under 10 years
- 10 years and under 13 years
- 13 years and over

For final judging the first place winner from each of the classes will be brought together for the judging of Best in Sweepstakes and Best Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes- rosette and 15% of total fees collected for Veteran Sweepstakes

Best of Opposite in Sweepstakes- rosette and 10% of total fees collected for Veteran Sweepstakes.

1st in each class- rosette and 50% of entry fees for that class

25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

Parade Of Versatility Title Holders (POV)

Saturday July 11, 2026, following Juniors

Our seventh annual Parade of Versatility Title holders will showcase the versatility of the Border Terrier. To be eligible for this event, a dog or bitch must have earned the BTC Versatility Title or Versatility Excellent Title and be owned or co-owned by a BTC member. To enter in the parade, a dog must be entered in a regular Specialty class or for Exhibition Only as well as the Parade of Versatility.

BEST OTTER HEAD

Following the judging of the specialty, we will be offering the Best Otter Head Class. This competition is free of charge but you must enter to be eligible. Our judges, Will Alexander and Caleb Campbell will select which Border Terrier among those present has the most typical "Otter Head". A Rosette and trophy will be awarded.

JUNIOR HANDLING

Saturday, July 11, 2026 (following sweeps)

Judge Caleb Campbell

Held under CKC rules

This event is for Border Terriers only. Dogs do not have to be owned by the handler. Dogs handled by the juniors must be entered in a Regular Conformation class or in Exhibition Only at this breed specialty.

Entries will be accepted at the show secretary's desk up to one hour prior. No exceptions. Free.

Competition is open to all Junior Handlers between the ages of 4 and up to 18 years of age (of the competition year). Pee Wees do not compete for best overall.

Pee Wees - participation rosette and prize

1st – 4th = in each class - rosette or ribbon & prize

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

BORDER TERRIER CANADA ROOM POLICY

(Adapted with Permission from The Border Terrier Club of America Room Policy)

Border Terrier Canada (BTC) has adopted the following rules in order to ensure that its members and their dogs will be welcome at hotels in the future. Any individual attending a Border Terrier Canada (BTC) sanctioned event and staying in a hotel, motel, inn or campsite/fairground has the responsibility of leaving that room or campsite exactly as found. This includes picking up after dog(s) on the grounds. Anyone who damages a room or campsite/fairground and does not report the damage to the hotel/campsite/fairground management, and make immediate restitution or arrangements to do so within a period of time agreed upon by the management, will be subject to any or all of the following actions by the BTC Board of Directors.

1. May be banned from showing at the next BTC sanction event(s).
2. May be subject to CKC sanctions.
3. Membership in the BTC may be terminated and may not be allowed to be reinstated.

Damages shall be defined as:

1. Flea infestation, urine, defecation and/or any damage to hotel/campsite/fairground property (walls, bedspreads, carpets, drapes, etc).

2. Any verified complaint by the host hotel/campsite/fairground.
3. Any verified complaint by a BTC member.

BTC Room Regulations:

1. All dogs shall be crated and quiet when left alone in a room. Noisy dogs shall be quieted upon request, even if this means the owner/handler must stay in the room with the dog.
2. Individuals will be expected to immediately report any damage by dogs or themselves to the hotel or campsite/fairground to management, and to assume complete financial responsibility for those damages.
3. No bathing or grooming will be allowed in rooms. A grooming area will be available whenever possible.
4. Dogs are to be allowed on hotel furniture/beds ONLY if the furniture is covered with protective covering provided by the owner/handler.
5. All owners/handlers will take preventative measures to assure that their dogs are free of fleas, mites, intestinal parasites and other communicable diseases prior to arriving at the hotel/campsite.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available online at www.ckc.ca

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC DAYLIGHT TIME.
7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the BTC, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

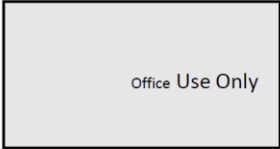
