Ms. Karen Day

I joined the Conformation world in 1984 with the addition of a Whippet to my household. He was unsuccessful in any event I entered him in.... perpetual "Reserve Winners", NQ in Obedience, or running back to mom when coursing. However, he got my foot in the door and a year later, I purchased my first Italian Greyhound. This dog finished his Championship with multiple group placings, and with him, my dedication to the breed was set. Since then, I have bred, handled and/or owned more Italian Greyhound Champions than I can count, likely 100 or more. My dogs have been successful in many countries, and many arenas. I have bred more Best in Show winners than any Canadian breeder and have the Best in Show record winning Italian Greyhound still exhibiting today. In 2023, I had the #1 IG in Canada as well as the #1 IG in the USA (All-Breed). Both different dogs. For many years, I also had Whippets. With the passing of my first Whippet, I obtained two Whippet girls, who were group winners, multi group placers, and Best Puppy in Group winners. I never bred my Whippets, once they retired, they were just household companions. With the passing of my third Whippet, I decided to stick with only Italian Greyhounds. My other love was Shetland Sheepdogs, though I owned only one, who I also successfully showed. I started judging in 2012, and I now judge all 7 groups, as well as Best in Show. I have judged in Canada, USA and Norway. I live on a 12,000 acre farm and ranch in Saskatchewan. My husband is the third generation to farm this land, which his grandfather homesteaded in 1912. We raise Red Angus cattle and grow cereal crops.



Ms. Lana Ferguson

Lana has bred Doberman Pinschers and Dalmatians. She has been breeding and showing dogs since 1973 and judging since 2016. Her kennel name is Legendale.



Mr. Todd Foley

Todd grew up in a dog show family. His parents bred Boxers since he can remember. At six years old he received his first show-dog, a whippet "Jet", who ended up winning multiple Best In shows. He competed in Junior Handling throughout his childhood and went on to be the Nova Scotia Junior Handling representative for the CKC. He has bred and shown dogs that have been successful at many levels throughout North America including a Westminster KC breed- winning Beagle, "Lil Ed". He also bred Standard Poodles, Kerry Blue Terriers, Salukis and Shetland Sheepdogs. Todd owner-handled the top winning Sheltie in Canadian History, Olivia – Am/Can Ch. Shelhaven Sweet Seduction, to 41 Best In Shows and the Canadian record setting Pug, "Adam" Am/Can Ch. Diamond Sand's Simply Perfect, to 31 Best In Shows. Todd has travelled all over the World to prestigious dog shows such as Westminster, Crufts and the World Dog Shows. He has since turned his focus to judging and is now judging the Herding and Working Groups and now on permit for Hounds.



Ms. Carmen Haller

Carmen has been showing/breeding since 1973 under the kennel name Carvon. She has bred Doberman Pinschers, Vizsla, Golden Retrievers Siberian Huskies and West Highland White Terriers. She has been judging since 1995 and in addition to Canada, she has judged in Argentina, Australia, China, Colombia, Finland, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Japan, Korea, Mexico, New Zealand, Philippines, South Africa, Thailand, USA.



Mr. Alejandro Rojas Sanchez

Alex was born in México City. Architect. / Language Teacher. I started in dog shows as amateur since 1992, competing formally since 1999. When I was a child I had dogs like Samoyed, Schnauzer and a few not purebred ones, but thanks to my love for sight hounds I bought my first show dog: an Afghan hound, I showed him and finished some offspring as national champions. In 2007 I decided to get a Saluki, showed him and getting several national and international titles. I worked as ring steward for more than 10 years, this allowed me to participate in the World Dog Shows hold in Mexico in 1999 and 2007, Champion of champion's tournaments, world specialty shows; I also attended seminars for judges. I have been judging since 2003 and have judged in Argentina, Australia, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, El Salvador, Equator, Guatemala, Honduras, Indonesia, Jamaica, Japan, Korea, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, South Africa and Venezuela.



Ms. Frances Smith-Moffat

FCI and FCA All Breed Judge and Director of the FCA National Genealogical Registry. She is the founding member and President of the Yorkshire Terrier Club Argentino. Involved with dogs since childhood and has grown up experiencing the dog world as an exhibitor, groomer, breeder, Judge, Club President and member and Director of the FCA Registry.

She breeds Yorkies under the prefix of "Las Heras" as well as has bred the "Von der Hall II" Wire Dachshunds, "Francesca" Bichons and "Viva Vaia" Shar-Pei. Her expertise ranges far into the world of Samoyeds, Argentine Dogo, Siberian Husky, Old English Sheepdogs, Pugs, Basset Hounds, Scottish Terriers and Golden Retrievers. Her work in pursuit of Purebred Dogs doesn't stop there: she is a published author of many Cynology works and courses as well as being involved as a Keynote Speaker and participating in Breeder and Judges Education.

In my real life I write commercials and did promotions for local radio and TV stations for 20 years. I have written weekly pet and gardening columns and was a reporter for a dog publication for 10 years.

I can't think of a time in my life when dogs didn't play a significant role. I came from a large family and we always had dogs when growing up in New Westminster. I started obedience training my very own first pup in 1963. She taught me a lot about the value of patience and consistency when working with these amazing animals. 
Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS- This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada.
(Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler **MUST** be the owner/co- owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A TCN dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class **MUST** be received by the Show Secretary **ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE BREED JUDGING ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED**. TCN fees will not be refunded.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

BABY PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male, Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group

VETERANS CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class **MAY NOT COMPETE** in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades **ONLY**

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

No dog may be entered in both Novice "A" and Novice "B", Open "A" and Open "B" at the same trial. In determining class eligibility, if a dog shall have won a particular title before being entered or moved up, the handler shall have been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores for the required title. (However, a dog may continue to be exhibited for 60 days in a class after winning a particular title.)

Dogs fulfilling the requirements for a title may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the show secretary at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.

PRE-NOVICE - The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of PCD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of CD may enter the Pre-Novice class.

NOVICE A - The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.

NOVICE B - The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises.

NOVICE C - The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title CD or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in Novice C indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs in the Novice C class are not eligible for High In Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE - The Novice Intermediate class is an elective class and earning this title is not a requirement to enter the Open classes. The Novice Intermediate class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a CD or any higher obedience trial titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle the dog in all 6 exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

OPEN A - The Open A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate family. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH title may not handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in these classes, any scores awarded will be cancelled.

OPEN B - The Open B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD. Dogs which have earned the title of CDX or any higher titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility Class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times.

UTILITY A - The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

UTILITY B - The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX or OTCH. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

RALLY CLASSES

No dog may be entered in both Novice "A" and Novice "B", Advanced "A" and Advanced "B" at the same trial or Excellent "A" and Excellent "B" at the same trial.

RALLY NOVICE A - Dogs competing in this class may not have earned the RN title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title or CKC RA title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY NOVICE B - Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY INTERMEDIATE - The Rally Intermediate class is an elective class for exhibitors and earning the title is not a requirement for a dog to enter Rally Advanced classes. This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RI or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class. Dogs may be entered in this class as a regular entry or changed to it from another official class within the same trial. The request to change must be made on the appropriate CKC form and be submitted to the trial secretary at least 30 minutes before the start of the trial.

RALLY ADVANCED A - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RN title but have not earned the RA title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title or CKC RE title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY ADVANCED B - This class will be for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RA title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY EXCELLENT A - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RA title, but have not earned the RE title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title, CKC RM title or CKC RAE title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY EXCELLENT B - This class will be for dogs that have earned the RA title. A dog completing the RE title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY MASTER - This class will be for dogs that have earned the RE title. A dog completing the RM title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

SCENT DETECTION

CLASSES, TITLES & AWARDS:

Titles may be earned by class or by component. A dog may be entered in either the class or the component they are eligible for. Titles will be awarded once requirements are met for the class or component. For complete details:

ENTRY LIMIT: These Trials are limited. If the tests fill, waiting lists will be kept and dogs from the waiting list may be entered and added.

Handlers may only handle 1 dog in each component at each level.

MOVE UPS: Same day trial move-ups will not be allowed. Move-ups for the Sunday trial are permitted. Please submit by the end of the first trial day.

JUDGING SCHEDULES: sent by email to exhibitors after the closing date. Schedules are based on 2 minutes per dog for Instinct, 9 minutes per dog for Novice and Open, 11 minutes per dog for Excellent, and Masters. Please allow for absentees and variances in the rate of judging.

EQUIPMENT: The dog may wear a buckle, snap or martingale collar and/or body harness in the ring. Collars/harnesses with tags may be worn in the ring. Harnesses may have the leash attached to the front clip or on the back. Electronic training and pinch collars are not allowed on the grounds.

PENALTIES ISSUED BY THE CLUB: Dropping food while rewarding is considered contamination. Contamination of the search area, at the discretion of the Judge may result in a non-qualifying score. Any dog that urinates or defecates or vomits within the search area will be excused from the class and will result in a non-qualifying score.

SCENT DETECTION RULEBOOK: It is up to the individual handler to review the CKC Scent Detection Rulebook prior to the trial.

REMINDER: That anyone discussing hides before the end of the trial will be excused and asked to leave as per CKC rules. Please show consideration for other competitors.

BITCHES IN SEASON: Bitches in season shall be eligible to enter the test but shall run last for the element entered.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available online at www.ckc.ca

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
6. **DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING.** The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are **PACIFIC TIME.**
7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog **BEFORE** taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
