It is the owner of the dog entered that is responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Please review email confirmations so corrections may be made **prior to closing date** to avoid disappointment.

4.1.5 No person may approach a judge whether directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

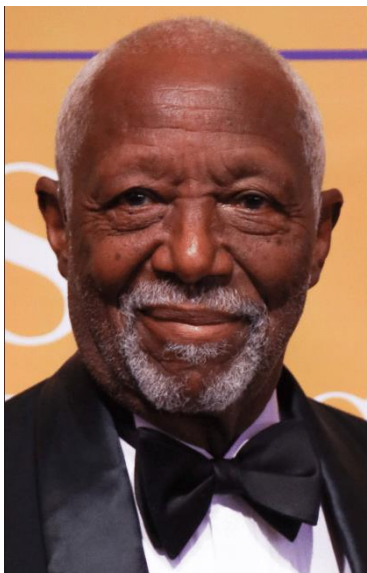
8.6.1 The authorities of any show may decline to accept entries for just cause.

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Note: CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than 90 days following the date of the event.

Mr. Eugene Blake

When I started in dogs, I didn't even think about that. Judging was not on my mind. I was 18 years old when I first got involved with dogs, and the way I got involved was that I used to drive a delivery truck for a drugstore in Houston, Texas. I worked there with another guy who asked me, "Gene, would you like to have a part-time job?" Well, I didn't have anything else to do, so I replied, "Yeah." He said, "There's this lady over here at the French Poodle shop who needs someone to bathe dogs. You ain't got to like dogs, all you gotta do is pretend you like dogs 'cause she really needs somebody." Well, I liked dogs, but I had never seen a purebred dog in my life. I was raised in the country where we had hunting dogs that stayed underneath the house. Anyway, I applied, and Hazel Hamm gave me the job. I started in September and worked there from 8 to 12. I would bathe some of the dogs, and then dry them before hustling over to the drugstore to work from 2 to 10. Any time I had a delivery over that way, I would go back and look at the dogs as they were being finished. I was just fascinated to see all the dogs I had never seen before. I like to let people know that I judge dogs to the Breed Standard. I've studied dogs to judge them to the Standard, and that's how I make my decisions. What I was thinking about doing is what I think about doing every time I walk through a gate at a dog show; that is, to find the best dog in that ring according to the Standard.



Ms. Carmen Haller

Carmen has been showing/breeding since 1973 under the kennel name Carvon. She has bred Doberman Pinschers, Vizsla, Golden Retrievers Siberian Huskies and West Highland White Terriers. She has been judging since 1995 and in addition to Canada, she has judged in Argentina, Australia, China, Colombia, Finland, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Japan, Korea, Mexico, New Zealand, Philippines, South Africa, Thailand, USA.



Ms. Dawne Deeley

I currently live in Chillwack, B.C., Canada, and have been in purebred dog sports since 1990. I bred my first litter (Carelian Bear Dogs) in 1996; my kennel name, 'TsarShadow' (CKC Perm Reg'd) reflects their history in that their country of origin—Finland—was a Russian Grand Duchy from 1809 to 1917. Following the Russian Revolution that year, Finland gained full autonomy, and thus came out from "under the Tsar's Shadow." Judging just happened. I love dogs of all varieties, and I truly believe that EVERY dog you put your hands on can teach you something, even if it's to recognize a breed-specific fault or shortcoming. Judging brings me a great amount of joy. I learn something every time I step in the ring, and I hope I've been able to guide a few exhibitors along the way as well.



Mr. Jack Kilgour

I am a second-generation dog fancier. I started showing dogs in 1970. As a junior handler I showed many different breeds, but soon decided to specialize in German Shepherd Dogs. My Kennel name is "Kijoda" (Perm. Reg'd). I bred my first litter of German Shepherd Dogs in 1980. That produced a Canadian National class-winning male who went on to become a champion and ROMC sire. Over the next 30 years I selectively bred approximately 15 litters. These produced 25 Canadian and American champions, several Selects, a Maturity Victor, 2 Futurity Victrix's, a Futurity Victor and many Register of Merit (ROM) producers. I handled a Canadian Grand Victrix, more than 25 U.S. and Can. National Specialty Selects, and more than 100 American and Canadian Champions.

I am a life member of the Canadian Kennel Club and The German Shepherd Dog Club of Manitoba. I am also a member of The German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada and

The German Shepherd Dog Club of America. I have been a licensed judge since. I look forward to continuing in this sport as a specialty and all-breed judge, and as an educator for my beloved breed.



**Ms. Janet Lobb
Mr. Joe Lobb**

CKC All Breed Judges, Joe and Janet Lobb live in a small village about 2 1/2 hrs west of Toronto, Ontario, Canada. We have two grown children, a daughter and a son, a son-in-law and two beautiful young Grand Daughters.



Now both retired, Janet enjoyed a 30 year career as a Data Base administrator for a Window and Door Manufacturer. Joe was involved in the Farm Equipment industry in Sales and Territory Management for over 45 years.

As far as Dog Show involvement, we are 'Life' members of the Canadian Kennel Club and belong to the 'Canadian Dog Judges Association'. We were founding members of the Bluewater Kennel Club which existed for over 35 years. We are also currently members of the American Fox Terrier Club and German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada.

We have limited our breeding and showing due to our involvement in dog judging and try to attend major Dog Show Events and Specialties in the U.S.A. and Canada for education & observation purposes. We are also quite interested in All Livestock exhibitions and try to attend these events as much as possible.

Janet started judging (1996) a few years earlier than Joe and is CKC licensed for 'All Breeds' Joe continued to show dogs for others for a couple more years due to some handling commitments, before jumping into the 'Judging ring' (2002) but is now also CKC licensed to judge 'All Breeds'.

We started "in dogs" in 1974 with a Doberman dog of show quality. Our first litter was whelped in 1977 under the 'Dobenhau' prefix. We were always a small kennel breeding only one litter per year. There have been many champions along the way from all litters, with many highlights. These include, Best in show, group winners, best in show puppy awards, several "awards of merit" at National specialties, best of winners at the Canadian national and "best in show" at the Doberman Pinscher club of Canada National Specialty in 1991. All of these dogs were breeder/owner handled. We also bred and owned the top producing female in Canada in 1990, with 7 champions finished that year, which in turn made us the Pedigree Pal Breeder of the year for Dobermans in Canada. (tied that year with Wrath/Liberator) In the late 1990's we were also co-breeders of Canada's Top Doberman.

In 1988 we added the smooth fox terrier breed under the " FauxPaw" prefix to our kennel. We started with a Ch.Tarb the Brat granddaughter, who gave us multiple Canadian and American champions in her two litters. We have had Canada's 'top smooth' on several occasions, and dogs that were either owned or bred by us have won the Canadian National Specialty three times. A particular win of note would be AOM at the American National (Montgomery) in an entry of one hundred and sixty seven.

Over the years we have had many excellent dogs of other breeds in our household and in our charge, some of which we owned and some we handled for other breeders and owners.

We handled professionally, (Joe primary and Janet more as assistant and backup) for twenty-five years. This consisted of some of Canada's top or top ranked dogs Handled breeds of note were Dobermans, Bernese Mtn dogs, Boxers, Australian cattle dogs, German Shepherd, Bouvier, Collies, Smooth fox terriers, Wheatens, Pugs, Chins, Setters, Springers, Golden Retrievers, Labs, Greyhounds, and two B&T Coonhounds, (both owner handled BIS winners.) We also owned, exhibited and are involved with the German Shepherd breed and handled at many Specialty events in the earlier years and now active members with the National club for GSD.

All Breed Handling highlights would include winning All Breed BIS and Specialty BIS(incl National events) with many of the above mentioned breeds. Joe piloted a Canadian bred Bernese Mtn. Dog to Best in Show at the American National Specialty as well.



Mr. Ricardo Saldana

"I am passionate about all breeds of dogs, concentrating on healthy dogs, sound moving dogs of correct type and temperament"...

Born in Mexico City, Ricardo Saldaña Solórzano grew up in a family of dog lovers. At 11 years old, he started participating in Dog Shows as owner-handler. Later he became a Steward for the Federacion Canofila Mexicana (Mexican Kennel Club), activity which he performed during many years; in this time he was steward for judges all around the world.

He participated actively as a steward and judge in the 1978, 1984, 1999 and 2007 World Dog Shows in Mexico City. He was member of the Board of the Federacion Canofila Mexicana for 20 years. He has represented Mexico in the General Assembly of the FCI meetings in Germany, Switzerland, Argentina, Belgium and Mexico. At 16 years old, he was judging his first match show. He obtained his first license to judge in 1980 and in 1988 he was credited as judge with international license to judge all breed by the FCM

and the FCI. He was judged in more than 40 countries, in many of the most prestigious shows. He has judged in World Dog Shows; Royal Shows in Australia; New Zealand and South Africa Championships; many of the most prestigious shows in USA and Canada; International FCI Shows in Asia, Sudamerica and Europe.

He was President of the School of Judges of the Federacion Canofila Mexicana; he has organized and participated in many seminars and conference to prepared new judges.

For 15 years he was President and Show Chairman of the Club Canofilo de Michoacán, in Morelia. He was owned dogs of various breeds like English Cocker Spaniel, Smooth Fox Terrier, Xoloitzcuintle, Toy Poodles, Pomerania and Smooth Chihuahueño; he has breed Labrador Retriever and American Cocker Spaniel. But his breed is the Pugs. He has breed Pugs for over 26 years, many of which have become Mexican, International champions and BIS winners. He is co-owner of the "Guivercelli Kennel", along with his wife Gabriela Guillen, breeding many more winning Pugs around the World and the top winning Pugs in Mexico. He has judged a Pug specialty show in Brazil, New Zealand, Russia and Argentina.

He wrote for a dog show magazine in Mexico, Argentina and USA and is a professional journalist, producer of television and specialist in institutional marketing.



Dr. Wanda Spediacci

I attended my first dog show in 1967 with my older brother. From the moment I walked onto the field, I knew this was something I wanted to do. From that point on, there was no turning back. We had always had dogs in our home, but the show world became a magical place for me.

I purchased my first Pug and proceeded to finish her championship. As a breeder/owner/handler I found my calling as well as a passion that is lasting my lifetime. With the help of my husband, Bruce, and our daughter, Ann, we continued the Heinzinger prefix on both our Rottweilers and Pugs, and now Cavalier King Charles Spaniels. We showed many dogs to their championships and over the years even managed to keep a few in the top ten.

Our daughter continued the family tradition, like her cousin, in showing in the Jr. Showmanship ring. She and I finished many champions from both breeds. To create well-balanced Rottweilers, we also enjoyed the obedience aspect and earned occasional companion dog titles on our working dogs.

My knowledge of the breeds began in earnest while teaching conformation classes over a ten-year period. As a member of two all-breed clubs, to local breed clubs our time was pretty much filled with dog activities. I have held every position

within an all-breed club and am currently the Secretary and Show Chairman for Richmond Dog Fanciers. This helps to understand the demands of putting on a dog show from both sides of the ring.

Continual education has always been important in our family. Attending seminars and National Study Groups has been a pleasure that I undertake whenever possible. Understanding breed type is the most fundamental element in judgement.

Like many others in this sport, exhibiting, breeding and teaching evolved in judging. I was first approved for Jr. Showmanship, then Rottweilers and Pugs. Within four years I was approved for the balance of the Working Group. I am now approved for the Non-Sporting Group and the Toy Group and am 3/4 through the Sporting breeds.



Ms. Satu Ylä-Mononen

Mrs. Ylä-Mononen began her experience in purebred dogs with the breeding and exhibiting of Bernese Mountain Dogs in her native Finland 1982. She became a judge in 1999 and today is a judge of several breeds from FCI group 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 8. Ms. Ylä-Mononen has judged in numerous countries around the world, spanning Europe, Australia and North America, including at the European and World Dog shows and the World famous Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show in New York, USA. Mrs. Ylä-Mononen is a very successful breeder in Bernese Mountain Dogs (prefix RICCARRON). She has owned/co-owned also Newfoundlands and Border Terriers. She has been very active in the club work. Nowadays she is President of the Finnish Dog Show Judges' Society, as well as a member of the Finnish Kennel Club's Show and Show Judges Committee.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9th, 2026 @ 9:00pm Pacific Time**

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS- This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada.
(Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler **MUST** be the owner/co- owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A TCN dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class **MUST** be received by the Show Secretary **ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE BREED JUDGING ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED**. TCN fees will not be refunded.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

BABY PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male, Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group

VETERANS CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class **MAY NOT COMPETE** in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades **ONLY**

UNOFFICIAL CLASS

BREEDER/OWNER/HANDLER - This class is for breeder/owner/handler. You must be entered in a Regular Class on the same day to be eligible and handle the dog at all levels to be eligible for BOH in Breed, BOH in Group and BOH in Show. There is no entry fee but you must enter this class separately online or check the box on the entry form provided for mailed in entries. No exceptions.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES (Friday, Saturday and Sunday PM)

Ring Size: 40' x 50'

No dog may be entered in both Novice "A" and Novice "B", Open "A" and Open "B" at the same trial. In determining class eligibility, if a dog shall have won a particular title before being entered or moved up, the handler shall have been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores for the required title. (However, a dog may continue to be exhibited for 60 days in a class after winning a particular title.)

Dogs fulfilling the requirements for a title may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the show secretary at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.

PRE-NOVICE - The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of PCD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of CD may enter the Pre-Novice class.

NOVICE A - The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.

NOVICE B - The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises.

NOVICE C - The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title CD or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in Novice C indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs in the Novice C class are not eligible for High In Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE - The Novice Intermediate class is an elective class and earning this title is not a requirement to enter the Open classes. The Novice Intermediate class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a CD or any higher obedience trial titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle the dog in all 6 exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

OPEN A - The Open A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate family. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH title may not handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in these classes, any scores awarded will be cancelled.

OPEN B - The Open B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD. Dogs which have earned the title of CDX or any higher titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility Class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times.

UTILITY A - The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

UTILITY B - The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX or UD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

RALLY CLASSES (Thursday AM & PM and Friday, Saturday and Sunday AM)

Ring Size: 40' x 50'

No dog may be entered in both Advanced "A" and Advanced "B" at the same trial or Excellent "A" and Excellent "B" at the same trial.

RALLY NOVICE A - Dogs competing in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice (R.N.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY NOVICE B - Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY INTERMEDIATE - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.I. or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

RALLY ADVANCED A - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY ADVANCED B - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY EXCELLENT A - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this case must be the owner, the co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class, A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class .However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY EXCELLENT B - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class, A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash except the Honor Exercise. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY MASTER - This class is for dogs that have earned the RE title. Any person may handle the dog in this class. Dogs must earn 3 qualifying scores of 85 points or more under at least 2 different judges.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from: online at www.ckc.ca

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC TIME.
7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

HERITAGE PARK FIRE SAFETY RULES:

Extension cord may not be stretched across fire lanes.

Tape of any kind is not to be used on the floors.

All power cords must be unplugged at night.

Aisles must be kept open at all times to allow everyone easy and speedy exit in case of emergency.

All designated FIRE LANES must be kept clear at all times or vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

ADDITIONAL CLUB RULES:

Only dogs entered will be allowed in the building.

Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Crates will be allowed at ringside during the judging of your specific breed only and must be removed immediately after. No Exceptions.

Dogs are not allowed in washrooms.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the days of these shows.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or vendors/concessions.

The Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

Delays waiting for dogs are not possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their dogs "conflict".

The club reserves the right of restricting exhibitors grooming space.

Plastic sheeting must be under all ex-pens.

Any tape used in the building has to be easily removable and must be removed after the show is completed. Coloured tape/duct tape and/or Gorilla Tape is not allowed. You must leave your setup in the same clean condition you found it in when you first arrived at the show.

Unless permission is granted in writing by the Mount Cheam Canine Association, there will not be any handling classes operated or offered by anyone in any part of the Heritage Park facility at any time.

Power bars are not permitted as they will blow fuses.

No paper from under the ex-pens or crates or liquid waste are to be disposed of in garbage cans. They must go in the bins provided outside the building. Anyone putting any dog papers or waste into garbage containers on floor one will not be permitted to enter future shows as Heritage Park may refuse to have dog events if this continues.

Please respect the vendors and do not put crates directly in front of the booths, or stand directly in front of their booths as you prevent potential customers from accessing the booths. No small dogs or grooming supplies to be put on any of the tables that are for club use.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022
